Law School Admission Test



<p>How much does the LSAT cost?</p>	<p>\$180 (+\$90 for late registration)</p>
<p>When is the test offered?</p>	<p>The available test dates can be found online at www.LSAC.org</p>
<p>Do I need to make an appointment?</p>	<p>Yes, no walk-in allowed. Make an appointment online at www.lsat.org to reserve a seat.</p>
<p>How long is the test?</p>	<p>There are 3.5 hours allotted for the LSAT. Test consists of five 35-minute sections (Reading Comprehension, Analytical Reasoning, and Logical Reasoning) of multiple choice questions and a 35-minute writing section.</p>
<p>How long does it take to get my scores back?</p>	<p>LSAT takers who have LSAC.org accounts will automatically receive their LSAT scores by e-mail approximately three weeks after taking the test. If you do not have an LSAC account, your scores will be mailed in approximately four weeks.</p>
<p>What do I need to bring to the test?</p>	<p>Bring your valid driver's license (first & last name must match registration), passport or government issued photo ID with signature, your admission ticket, and four sharpened No. 2 or HB wooden pencils. Other permitted items may be found at http://lsac.org/jd/lsat/day-of-test. *Student ID is not an accepted form of identification</p>
<p>Is there a study guide?</p>	<p>Yes, free study guides can be downloaded at www.LSAC.org</p>
<p>What if I have to reschedule?</p>	<p>If you are unable to take the LSAT on the date for which you are registered, you may request a change to another test date by logging onto your LSAC.org Account if the test date change deadline has not passed. Your request must meet the designated test date change deadlines available online.</p>
<p>What if I need to cancel my appointment?</p>	<p>Upon written request, LSAC will cancel your appointment. You will be refunded \$49 if the written request is received by the refund deadline available online at www.lsat.org/jd/lsat/lsat-cas-refunds</p>
<p>Can I cancel my scores?</p>	<p>Your answer sheet will contain a section allowing you to cancel your score. If you wish to cancel scores after you have taken your test you can do so by logging onto your LSAC.org Account and going to the LSAT Status page. The request must be received to LSAC within six calendar days of the test.</p>
<p>How often can I take the LSAT?</p>	<p>You may not take the LSAT more than 3 times in any two year period.</p>
